## **PATHWAYS HOME 2**

## A PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Pathways Home 2 can provide eligible individuals incarcerated in state prisons or local/county jails with workforce development services prior to their release and following their transition back into the community. The program is job-driven and builds on connections with local employers that will enable transitioning individuals to obtain meaningful employment post-release.

## **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

- Must be 18 years or older
- Must be convicted of current charges
- Must reside in a state, county, or local facility—No federal institutions
   However, federal halfway houses,
   DOC residential facilities, home
   confinement programs, and
   electronic monitoring programs ARE
   eligible
- Have between 20 and 180 days until planned exit date
- Returning to an eligible county\*
- Must be legally eligible to work in the U.S.
- Veterans receive priority consideration



## WHAT CAN PATHWAYS PROVIDE?

- Career services and employment assistance
- Financial assistance for educational resources (tuition, books, fees, supplies)
- Financial assistance for training programs and skills development
- Financial assistance for support (childcare, transportation, vehicle repairs, uniforms, tools and equipment, housing, etc.)
- Financial assistance for outpatient substance use and mental health treatment services

\*Eligible counties include: Calumet, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Waupaca, Waushara, and Winnebago.
